



Walks round Peaslake for you to undertake! The walks are mainly over footpaths, sometimes cross over stiles and farmland, or through the woods and over tracks in the Surrey Hills. Extensive views to the North Downs or South Downs can be enjoyed.

Each walk takes one and a half or two hours to complete

Starting Point: Peaslake Stores, Peaslake

Walk 3:

A Circular Walk from Peaslake Stores onto Holmbury Hill: 1 hr 25 mins

A lovely walk through the Woods, along country lanes and past pretty houses to walk over fields before joining tracks on Holmbury Hill.

With the Stores in front of you, take the road to the RHS (Radnor Road) Either go through the wooden barrier, immediately on the left and climb the steep hill to the barrier at the top on a tarmac road (Plaws Hill) *or if you wish to avoid the climb walk up Radnor road, turning left into Plaws Hill.*

With the top barrier behind you, walk straight ahead, passing Tor Cottage on your left. The path rises towards a kissing gate leading to a narrow footpath next to the garden of Lindeth House. This will take you onto Holmbury Hill. You will be walking part of the Millennium Trail.

Keep straight, going down the slope to meet a wide firebreak in Riding Bottom. Turn left to exit the woods onto a small car park (used as parking for Peaslake School) Bear right on Colemans Hill and walk towards the School.

Before reaching the School, turn right onto a narrow track at the side of the pretty listed Hollybush Cottage. This narrow passage leads to a small gate on the left and onto the paved road of Franks Field. Follow this road to the end, turn left and then right between Barnfield and Keepers Cottage.

At the end enter the paved road, passing Timbers Ridge, keep left onto a short, narrow track to cross a stile!! Here there is a lovely walk across the field with views across the valley. Cross directly over the field to climb over another stile – watch out for ponies in the field! After the 2nd stile, go down the hill to the track at the bottom, turn right. The back of houses in Sutton Place can be seen, above you, on the left hand side. The track takes you through a gate, where another narrow track leads onto a wooded area of Holmbury Hill. Cross a paved road, walk past fields above you on LHS and, after a barrier, take the 2nd narrow path to drop down to the right and turn right onto a wider bridleway. This turns you back towards Peaslake. The bridleway runs between 2 ponds (previously Village watering points)

Keep straight, climb a short distance before continuing on this undulating track until you see evidence of an earth bank ahead of you and an obvious path coming in from the LHS. The way is a bit indistinct here but focus on keeping straight!!

Footpath and Millennium Way signs will direct you. Look for a tall wire fence to the right, at the side of a field.

Cross over the track and through the earth bank – bearing slightly right and then left and (keeping the metal fence on your right use this to direct you) walk down the bridleway. At the end of the fence the path drops into a gully (often muddy) to emerge on the wide firebreak in Riding Bottom.

Going to the right, you join the start of your walk. So turn left to take you up the short hill, which leads up to the staggered barrier, where you enter the narrow footpath by Lindeth House.
