



Walks round Peaslake for you to undertake! The walks are mainly over footpaths, sometimes crossing over stiles and farmland, or through the woods and over tracks in the Surrey Hills. Extensive views to the North Downs or South Downs can be enjoyed.

Each walk takes one and a half or two hours to complete

Starting Point: Hurtwood Inn, Peaslake

Walks 1 & 2

Circular Walks to 'the top of Peaslake' with views to the North Downs 1 – 1 ½ hours

Leaving from the Hurtwood Inn front Porch, turn right to go up the path (through a small kissing gate) to the LHS of the Inn. This leads up a steep path to a field, stay on the left until you see a large house (Quakers). Before the house, turn right, through an avenue of trees. A small gate takes you on a footpath past the back of Hazel Hall. Follow this track to the right until another gate leads onto a tarmacked road – Pond Lane.

Turn left. Just in front of you at a road junction with Burchetts Hollow, take the small gate left of a 5 bar gate. A footpath runs across a field, with lovely views to Newlands Corner and the North Downs. The footpath descends through a gate onto a tarmac road (Jessies Lane)

Turn right, then immediately right again, over a stile. Follow a track through the field, keeping slightly right at a junction of hedges, climbing over 2 more stiles to exit the fields and join the road at Pursers Farm Barn.

Turn right onto Pursers Lane and then left into Hoe Lane. The road rises fairly steeply, past Hoe Farm, until you reach Franksfield on the RHS. Enter FranksField.

Keep straight past a pretty cottage on your left (Keepers Cottage).

Turn right at the next junction and follow the road to the end, exiting Franksfield through a small gate. Turn right down the track to meet Colmans Hill Road past the delightful listed Hollybush Cottage. On reaching the road turn left (away from Peaslake School) this road joins Mackies Hill at the school car park. At the parking area, look to your left to go through the wooden barrier and onto a wide firebreak.

Follow the firebreak for a short while into Riding Bottom. Turn right where there is a junction of paths. You will now be on the Millenium way footpath. Follow the steep, short hill to see a staggered barrier – next to a footpath sign. The track runs between a wooden fence and a field to emerge through a kissing gate onto Plaws Hill.

Keep straight ahead return downhill to the village of Peaslake

On reaching Jessies Lane. Turn right keeping Oak Farm on your LHS.

Turn left at the next field gate, walking on the footpath past an ornamental duck pond on your right).

Another small gate takes you onto Lawbrook Lane, cross over here to enter into a field. Keep right on this footpath to the top of the short hill. Go through the hedgerow, keeping on the footpath. A short distance after this look out for a stile on the LHS. Climb over and follow the track to the left and around the field, through a 5 bar gate. Enjoy the beautiful views of the Surrey Hills as you walk. Look out for a footpath sign on the left which then takes you

diagonally across another field to where the hedge opens up allowing you to drop down onto Lawbrook Lane. Turn right and pass Lane End Farm on your right. Walk along the road to turn left onto Pond Lane.

Walk on Pond Lane to reach Peaslake village (passing Hazel Hall on your right) with the Hurtwood Inn at the end of your walk.
